



# **SCIENCE NEWS**

There was a breakthrough with a telescope called the James Webb space telescope. It's especially important to see outer space, and new things like what Webb found in the atmosphere of K2-18b. K2-18b is an exoplanet 8.6 times bigger than Earth. Webb found methane and carbon dioxide in K2-18b's atmosphere, then found the pressure of carbon-bearing molecules. K2-18b has the pressure of the ocean and it is about 7300 pounds of pressure at 500 meters. The next thing is a cool dwarf star, which happens to be K2-18b's parent start. This system is 120 light years away from Earth.

## **VANDERBILT HISTORY**

Vanderbilt was first settled as early as 1875, when the Michigan Central Railroad was planned to extend north of Gaylord. This settlement was named after Cornelius Vanderbilt, who owned land in Corwith Township. A post office was built in 1880 and the railway reached the settlement in 1881. It was during this decade that the settlement grew. A number of houses and industrial buildings were built during this time, including a school house and two churches.

After this, it is hard to find more information of the history of Vanderbilt, but it is evident that the railroad is no longer in use, and was recently turned into a trail running through Michigan. Vanderbilt continues to thrive, with the 2020 U.S. census claiming the population of Vanderbilt as close to 500.
